
Melvin & Anita McIntosh


ARE YOU ENJOYING GOD'S BEAUTIFUL SPRING?


Now at home, he will have to keep his leg elevated for several weeks with a 20 week recovery period. No flying airplanes, driving boats, or skiing during that time.
