
"Amazing Grace"

Vernon Faircloth, loving and cherished husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and friend passed away peacefully, after a brief illness, on Saturday, January 29, 2005. He will be dearly missed by many.

Mr. Faircloth, 85, was born in Andrews, South Carolina. A 1942 graduate of The Citadel, he served as a pilot in the US Marine Corps and as a flight instructor for pilots during World War II. In 1943, he married Nella Rac Faddy, his wife of 61 years. After the war, he attended and graduated from pharmacy school at the University of South Carolina. Mr. Faircloth was a pharmacist in Charlotte for 47 years, providing expert advice and a friendly smile to everyone he served. He was an active and faithful member of Dilworth United Methodist Church for 53 years, an avid gardener, a fun traveler, devoted family member, and lover of life. His encouraging and generous spirit was a great gift to our world.
